In 2009, **69%** of the victims who reported domestic violence to law enforcement had received some sort of minor injury.



The 2007-08 Biennial report of the Iowa Domestic Abuse Death Review Team reported that the most common means of death was by firearm. Gunshot wounds were the cause of death in **67.3 %** of all the deaths.



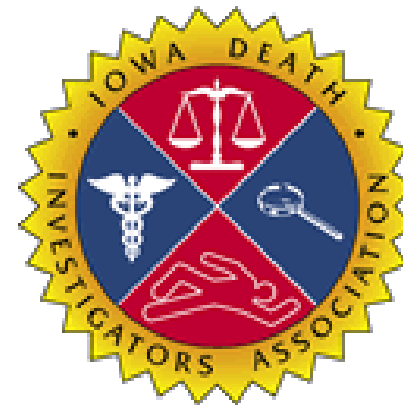
Stop and think about how many calls you respond to each day that are in some way related to domestic violence.

There were **268** petitions for civil protection orders filed with the clerk of Courts in Woodbury County in 2010.

National studies conclude that women are at greatest risk of homicide when they file for divorce, obtain a protection order or make other efforts to end the relationship. In **51 percent** of the cases reviewed for this report, the couple had not been separated; in another **30 percent**, the homicide occurred within the first month of separation. 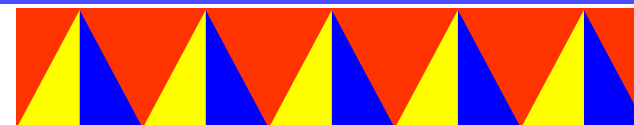

Dr. Henry Carson

Henry J. (Harry) Carson is a pathologist at Mercy Hospital in Iowa City. Since 1997, he has performed forensic autopsies for many Eastern Iowa counties and has served as a deputy medical examiner in Linn County. In 2009-10, he spent a year at the Jackson County Medical Examiner's Office as a fellow in forensic pathology. He has published a number of articles in the forensic literature.

Ms. Kirsten Faisal

Kirsten Faisal has been the state trainer for the Iowa Coalition Against Domestic Violence since 1995, where she helps develop public policy, and provides technical assistance and training to agencies that impact battered women and their children. She is on the steering committee of the Batterer's Education Program for the Iowa Department of Corrections and the Iowa Domestic Abuse Death Review Team. She has served as an expert witness in civil and criminal domestic abuse cases and graduated with honors from Iowa State University with a B.A. in anthropology.

She works directly out of the Sioux City Police Department and works closely with law enforcement and the prosecutor's office for victims of crime.
